The Fox School Honors Program is available to students who have completed AP or high school honors courses, rank in the top 10 percent of their class and score in the top percentiles on the SAT or ACT. The program is also available to transfer students who complete at least 24 credits at an accredited college and earn at least a 3.6 GPA.

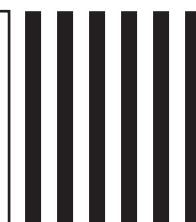

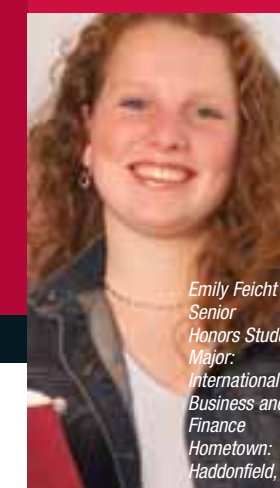

As a Fox School Honors student, you are eligible to apply for two scholars programs.

TempleLaw Scholars

TempleLaw Scholars provides an opportunity for you to gain provisional admission to Temple University's Beasley School of Law at the same time you are accepted into The Fox School of Business and Management. You spend your undergraduate studies in The Fox School's Honors Program with a major in legal studies and then you have the option to continue on to the Beasley School of Law.

The Fox School Research Scholars

As a Fox School Honors student, you have an opportunity to be a research assistant with a Fox faculty mentor. You assist your mentor in research projects, learn about research completed in your major, attend research conferences, and perform independent research during your final year, resulting in a senior thesis that will be presented at the Research Scholars Colloquium. As part of this program, you also receive \$1,000 tuition remission that is renewable each year you remain in the program.
